

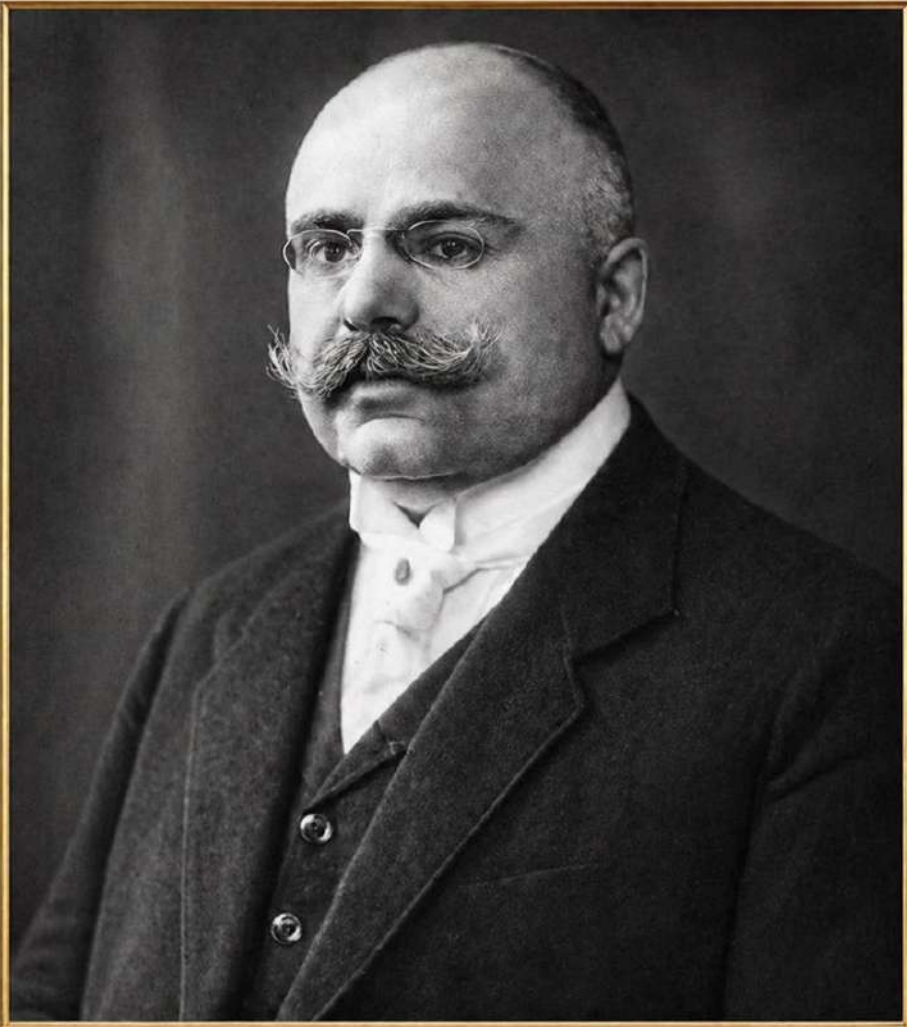

Felix Fränkel

Dr. Felix Frankel (1886)

- ***First described a case of adrenal tumor associated with severe hypertension***
- ***Recognized the clinical syndrome***



Ludwig Pick (1912)
(1868–1944)

Dr. Ludwig Pick (1912)

- ***Coined the term “pheochromocytoma”***
- ***Named for the characteristic color change with chromium salts (“dusky tumor”)***

Dr. Max Schottelius

- **Described chromaffin cells**
- **Established the cellular origin of the tumor**
